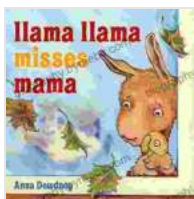

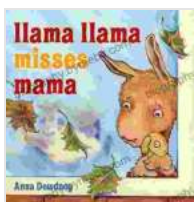
Dewdney began her career as a freelance illustrator. She illustrated books for other authors, including Jane Yolen and J.K. Rowling.
