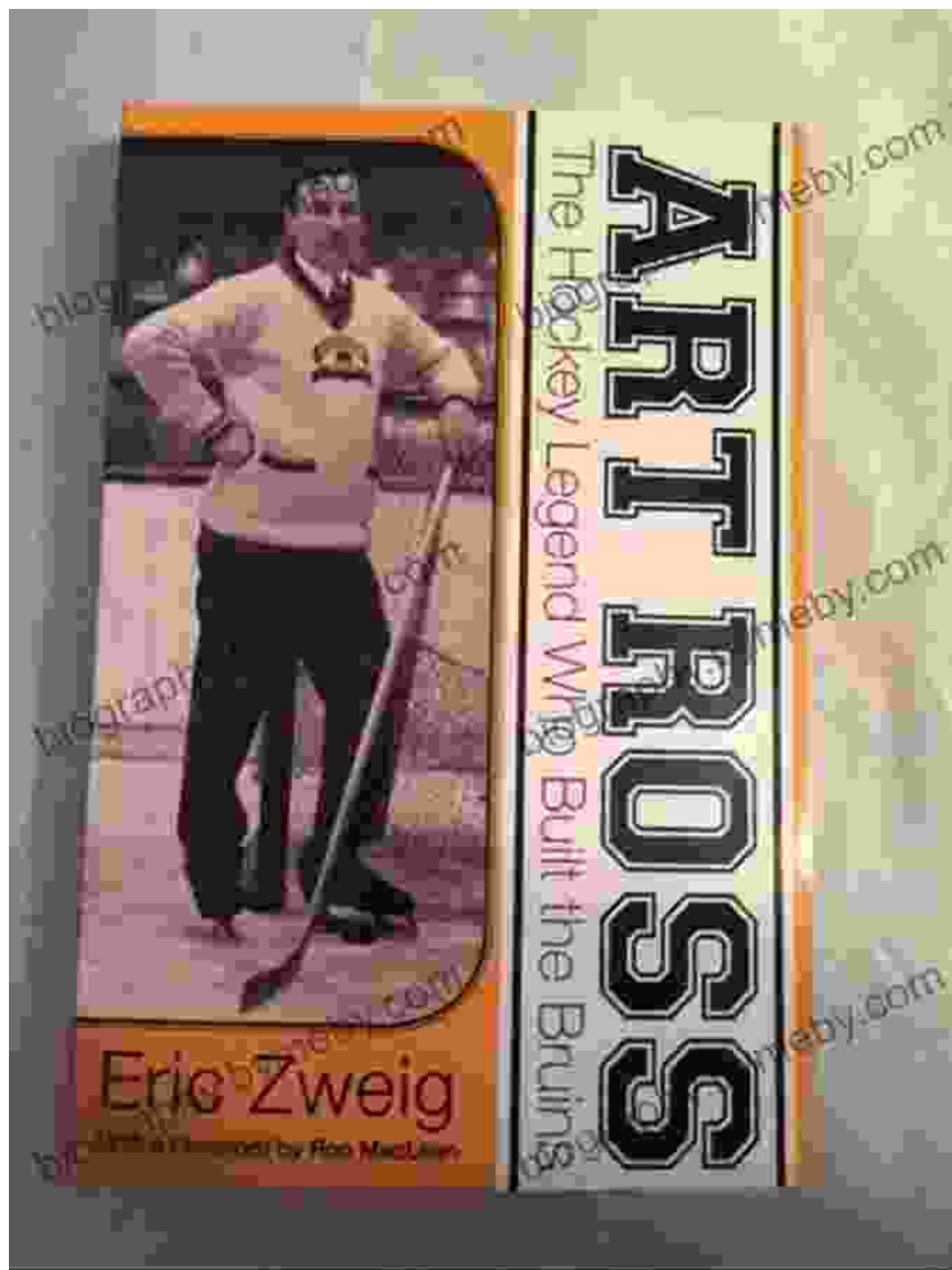
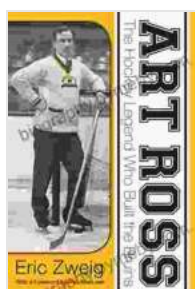


The Hockey Legend Who Built The Bruins

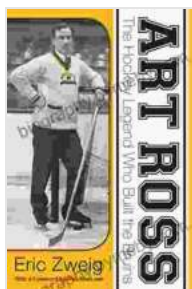

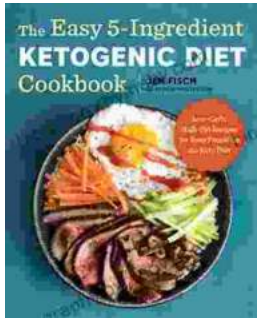
