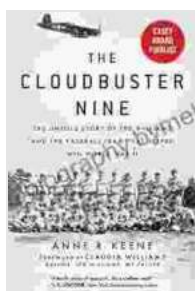


The Untold Story of Ted Williams and the Baseball Team That Helped Win a World War

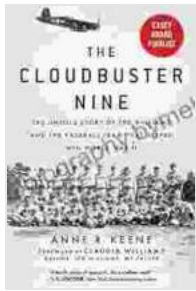

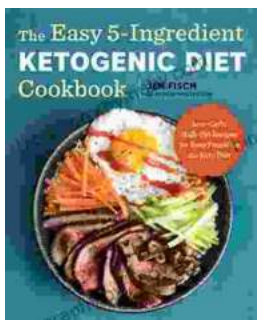
