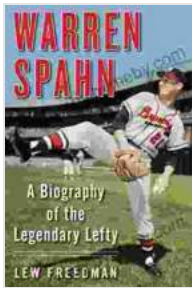


# Warren Spahn: A Legendary Lefty

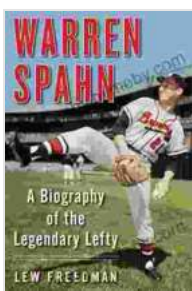

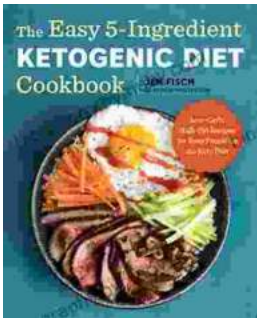
